#### Principal's report (Marianne Harvey & Marc Laliberté)

Welcome to teachers Mara Belitzky and Daniel Renaud attending Parents Council this evening.

#### Update on School Activities:

- Blues in the Schools to start next week and run for two weeks.
- Winter Activity Days are going very well.
- Pink Shirt Days are Feb 27<sup>th</sup> to encourage everyone to practice kindness and symbolize that you do not tolerate bullying, and April 10<sup>th</sup> to show support for LGBTQ issues and symbolize that you do not tolerate bullying.
- February 15<sup>th</sup> PD Day with staff focused on Math. Looked at MathUP Classroom (Created by Marian Small, is a comprehensive online instructional solution that helps build teachers' knowledge and understanding of mathematics so they can better help students). Equipment and resources were reorganized, the math resource room is now an available classroom.
- The primary team will participate in a Physical Literacy Day March 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Mr. Renaud is coordinating for the Grade 8 students to participate again this year in the Enrichment Mini-Courses Program. Students choose a week long course to attend at one of the Participating Academic Institutions such as Carleton University, University of Ottawa, Saint Paul University and La Cité Collégiale.

Parking Lot Safety: Drop off and Pick Up – **Student safety is an ongoing serious concern.** There continues to be an increase in the number of cars dropping off students in the morning at the front of the school, and in the "no stopping" zone on Valin Street and Provence Avenue. Mrs. Harvey and Mr. Laliberté continue to ask parents to follow the rules of the road as clearly posted, and are working with Ottawa Police Service School Resource Officer and City of Ottawa Bylaw officers to enforce this. The City of Ottawa

Technology – We received 45 Chromebooks and 12 iPads for students, as well as 3 computers for the teacher's prep room. There will be 6-7 Tech Tubs created that teachers can sign out to use in the classroom. There was an assessment of technology in the schools and to support equity in education, the Board implemented a board wide technology program, to be rolled out over five years. Maple Ridge was seen as a school with great needs so this year was our year, second in the five year program. The idea was that every teacher would have a working laptop or tower (personal computer) and there would be a 1 device to 4 student ratio.

#### Chair Report (Cynthia Allen)

- PRO Grant \$1000- Scientists in School Family Science evening April 4, 2019, 6:00-8:00 pm. More detail to come in March. Volunteers will be needed to assist. Communication to be sent home closer to the date along with links to sign up for the sessions.
- SWL-OES fundraiser Sir Wilfrid Laurier SS is running a fundraiser in April 27<sup>th</sup>/28th in the Ray Friel parking lot. Please see link for further details of electronics accepted <a href="https://ontarioelectronicstewardship.ca/">https://ontarioelectronicstewardship.ca/</a>
  The funds raised will go to the purchase of a laser cutter which will make precision cuts and engravings. At the moment, teachers are taking the students work in the evenings and having the assignments completed using the Ottawa Public Library's equipment. SWL is reaching out to the feeder schools to get the word out. The goal is to have one at the school to benefit not only the current students but future incoming students as well.

  Mrs. Harvey Mr. Laliberté will inquire to the Board to see if the school's old tech equipment could be donated.

  Note: fundraiser is based on weight, so larger items such as old T.V.s would be appreciated.
- OCASC update Health and Physical Education Curriculum. As the current provincial government has indicated
  that it will take approximately one year to collate all the data and feedback that was received as part of the <u>2018</u>
  <u>Consultation: Education in Ontario</u>, OCASC has put forward three 'Notice of Motion' items. Each respective
  Council is asked to discuss these motions (listed below) and determine how the council's representative is to
  vote.
  - 1. Notice of Motion: Request that OCASC reps ask PIC to write to the Minister of Education and state the following:
    - a year is an excessive delay for a response to the 2018 Consultation: Education in Ontario; and
    - the modern Health and Physical Education curriculum, as was taught in 2015, should be reinstated; or school boards should be given the option to reinstate the curriculum, for the interim period before the consultation response.
  - 2. Notice of Motion: Request that OCASC reps ask PIC to relay concerns, to the Board and the Ministry, about the practice of reporting teachers who answer students' questions around physical health and wellness. This practice creates a climate of distrust that is not conducive to open and equitable discussions amongst teachers, staff, and students.
  - 3. Notice of Motion: Request that OCASC ask PIC to clarify whether School Councils can engage parents and offer programming, during school hours, on the subjects from the 2018 Consultation: Education in Ontario.

All three 'Notice of Motion' items were discussed and it was the unanimous decision of the Council for the OCASC representative to vote to support these motions.
