

# **Fundraising Initiatives & Grants**

Fundraising is one of the core functions of this Maple Ridge ES Council. Thank you to all the volunteers that assisted in the success of the many fundraising activities by collecting forms and money, selling food, delivering items to the classrooms and organizing tasks.

Council fundraising activities included:

- · Pizza lunches April, May & June

Purdys Chocolate Campaign – This year we didn't have the fall fundraising campaign but deferred to spring. Although successful with profits exceeding \$700, the choice of products was limited. Moneys raised went to support the school improvement plan and student achievement. Thank you to everyone that participated.

Council was excited to be able to offer a few pizza days this year. Pizza supplied by River Pizza was offered monthly in April, May and June. The number of slices ordered was the highest they have been in over 10 years demonstrating how popular pizza days are with the students & parents/guardians. This is an extremely important fundraiser for Council. This program is largely dependent on both adult and student volunteers. Thank you to everyone that helped to make this fundraiser so successful, allowing Council to offer this service to our school community.



Maple Ridge Council has been fortunate throughout the years to obtain funding from various granting sources and this year was no different. We received two grants.

# School Council Purchases & School Support this year

Library – Books for the Forest of Reading Club – very popular with the students. This is a
great program to encourage children to read. The program consists of both French and
English books written by first time Canadian authors. The books are striated by age into 4
reading levels. The students sign up for the appropriate level. As they read the books or

have the books read to them, they keep track on a wall chart. They read a minimum of five books to be eligible to vote at the end of the year for their favorite. The program is Canada wide. The students become very invested in



the book club and so proud when their choice wins the top award. Thanks to our dedicated librarian, Mrs. Dunn, the book club was again a successful program.



# **School Council Activities** – In addition to fundraising, Council activities included:

Communications & School presence - This was on top of the 9 monthly Council meetings where extensive minutes were captured. All minutes and documents are uploaded in a timely manner to the Council tab of the school website

Parent Council members worked with grade 8 students to establish a Yearbook Committee again this year. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic restrictions, the group met virtually on a regular basis as well as in-person meetings when permitted. The OCDSB printing services were hired to print the books. All grade 8 students, both in school and those that attended virtual learning were provided a yearbook at no charge to the students. Thank you to the parent volunteers that provided oversight of this important activity.



This year MRES Council was an active member of OCASC (Ottawa Carleton Assembly of School Councils). OCASC meetings were conducted virtually this year. An OCASC update is made available to Maple Ridge parents on a monthly basis.

Council conducted the review of the Maple Ridge Elementary School Council Constitution. As outlined in the constitution, the document must be reviewed every three years for accuracy.

Family Science Evening – With the support of PRO grant funding, on May 30<sup>th</sup>, 2022, Council hosted 4 virtual *Family Science Evening* workshops facilitated by Scientists in School. Close to 100 science kits were distributed to registrants prior to the event. Council received very positive feedback and are hopeful to pursue similar events in the future.

On-going initiatives – Council continues to maintain a 'Student Alumni List' where on occasion, high school students may be asked if they would like to volunteer to help with future school projects. Volunteering at Maple Ridge is a great way for students to acquire the mandatory volunteer hours as required by the Ministry of Education to graduate high school.

# Challenges

Maple Ridge is fortunate to have a group of very dedicated parents and community members. The electronic communications via email messaging, website updates and social media have helped to reach parents. We will continue to improve upon our communication strategies.

All council meetings for the current year were held virtually using Google Meets. Virtual meetings may be a challenge for some parents/guardians. Moving forward Council is hopeful to adopt a hybrid model that will allow for even greater attendance.
