<u>Approval of Meeting Agenda:</u> Motion to add discussion regarding Ottawa Robotics programing during the Round Table; Cynthia motioned to approve, all in favour. Agenda approved.

<u>Old Business/Approval of November 7th minutes:</u> Pam Dossett motioned to approve; seconded by Anu Kwatra. All in favour. Minutes approved.

Principal Report (Appendix 1): Mireille Filion/Jenna Anderson

A slide show was presented to Council (Appendix 1)

General Updates (Mireille Filion)

- New EA: Karen Maillet, Still have no ECE to replace Sarah Baptiste. Supply Teacher Abigail Kalan regularly returning to cover any absence for the 31 staff
- Maple Ridge has two DOT (designated occasional teacher) Mr. Fancy and now there is a second DOT, Abigail Kalan
- Maple Ridge currently has 533 students

School Budget (Mireille Filion)

• At the moment, the budget for all OCDSB schools are frozen for any purchase over \$100 Expecting to receive the remaining 50% of the budget in January.

- Operating at a loss for most of field trips the cost of the activity and the bus is
 expensive, some parents request refunds if their child doesn't go, a lot of students are
 opting out or just not paying, looking at increasing fees slightly or possibly gauging
 interest before booking the activity.
- \$240/ day to cover a replacement teacher when teachers attend sports tournaments, the cost last year was approximately \$4000, this year we are already at \$2500
- Another large expense is photocopy and printing paper. Last year \$17,000 on paper
- Exploring ideas for next year to balance the budget, an example would be to increase student levy next year.

2022-2023 Parent Survey Results (Mireille Filion)

- There were only 66 responses received which equals 16% participation
- With so few respondents, it is difficult to say that the results accurately reflect the school
- Strengths (well-being) and weaknesses (intellectual engagement, parent engagement, diversity) were identified
- Well being, student-staff relationship, above Board average
- Parent engagement was identified as a challenge but some parents do not respond when given opportunities such as Parent/Teacher interviews. There was only 50% participation rate

2022/2023 EQAO results overview (Jenna Anderson)

- Grade 3 students % students at or above provincial standard
 - o Math 54%
 - o Reading 70%
 - Writing 70%

These results are approximately the same as results for the rest of the OCDSB grade 3 classes and the province for reading and writing. The math results are slightly below the Board and Provincial levels at 61% and 60%, respectively. The lower results could be because of digital format of the exam, delayed learning due to the Covid-19 pandemic

25% of grade 3 students, English was not their first language.

- Grade 6 Results
 - o Math 62%
 - o Reading 89%
 - Writing 91%

By comparison, Maple Ridge grade 6 students are above both the Board and the Provincial results for all three.

- Scholastic Book Fair huge success with over \$6,000 in sales!! That translates into \$1600 in new books for the Library and \$600 in cash to spend at a later date. Many thanks to "Gramma" Barb and her daughter Colleen for all their hard work and dedication.
- R45A Habitat for Humanities Project ``What makes a home?" junior writing contest. Each student entry gives a \$10 donation to our local group. Students have started brainstorming by creating collages of what tangible and intangible things make their home a special place. Students are excited to both help out with their entries...and excited for the possibility of a grand prize an ipad and pizza party

Chair Report: Cynthia Allen

- PTBM Grant Application submitted. Results to be communicated by December 18th. Two presentations by Paul Davis, confirmed for March 5th, 2024 for grades 3-8.
- PRO Grant Parent Reaching Out Applications due on January 12th, 2024.
 - \$750 for projects that promote engagement and collaboration involving parents, caregivers and guardians within our school community.
 - November 26 email communication sent to Council requesting feedback and options for application

 just over \$3000 for a profit of just under \$1000. Proceeds to financially support the
 Meet the Keepers presentations in January.

<u>Financial Summary Appendix 2</u>: Jennifer Tracey

Most commitments have been paid. There are two items that Council committed to pay that the final costs were slightly higher than what had been voted on.

- Council had committed \$1000 for the 2023 Grad & Yearbook. The final cost was \$1037, an excess of \$37.49
- Council had committed \$150 for the Primary Bubble Day last June 2023. The final cost was \$153.48, an excess of \$3.48.

The treasurer opted to pay these extra nominal amounts without a Council vote since several other commitments were below the amounts that Council had voted to spend, such as the Forest of Read books, drying rack, tables.

<u>Vote by e-mail:</u> Council discussed purchasing new 6-foot long folding tables at the October 3/2023 Council meeting. There was a sale at Canadian Tire for 6-foot heavy duty portable plastic & metal folding tables. The sale price was \$89.99. These tables are normally \$110-\$140 elsewhere.

An email was sent to all Council members on Thursday, November 9/2023 requiring a quick vote. To purchase 6 tables at \$89.99 plus 13% HST each, the motion was to spend **\$625**. Vote **YES or NO** by end of day, Friday, November 10/2023.

<u>RESULTS:</u> 18 Yes votes.....0 NO votes Motion passed to spend up to \$625 on folding tables.

- \$575 stackable stools to be used in the main foyer as a type of roaming classroom, most economical choice is from IKEA, MARIUS black, 45 cm stool.

Anu Kwatra brought forward the possibility of organizing an after school program facilitate by Ottawa Robotics. If Council is interested, the owner could attend the January Council and demonstrate the programming that can be offered. Council members were enthusiastic about the program. The administration is going to discuss prior to the January Council meeting.






